
## To the Honorable Board Members of the Ohio Commission on Hispanic/Latino Affairs

Programming for the months of April and May continue to focus on the response to the COVID-19 Pandemic and some of our regularly scheduled meetings and events. Although our team has not been able to travel to the communities, we are continuing to stay closely in touch via telephone and virtual conference calls with leaders and have actively engaged in the Latino Networking Meetings across Ohio.

### Highlights of our COVID 19 Response:

#### -Translations

We are providing translations to different offices in state government, with an emphasis placed on the needs of the Governor's Office and the Department of Health. To date, we have translated a total of 225 documents distributed as follows:



**COVID-19 Communications strategy and outreach—**

We are implementing our strategy to present timely information using all available communication channels. To date, a total of 43 live Radio shows have been hosted by La Mega Radio at 5:00 pm for the “Reporte Informativo” to highlight key points covered by Governor DeWine and his team during the press conferences. La Mega Radio audience includes major metropolitan areas in Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, their online La Mega virtual radio, and since last month La Mega Facebook Live has been covering the entire state and virtual community. Mujer Latina Today has also hosted Executive Director Cavanaugh regularly for the “Minuto Informativo”.

Our footprint in the social media space continues to remain strong with a Facebook total post reach of 30,630 in April and 25,557 in May. Twitter’s number of followers increased from 959 in April to 969 in May and Instagram followers went from 584 in April to 609 in May. Our [OCHLA.OHIO.GOV](http://OCHLA.OHIO.GOV) website had a total of 17,319 views in April and 12,423 in May, with the homepage and Coronavirus Bilingual Resources getting the largest number of views. More details on the outreach efforts are included in the Latino Community Report.

**Participation in COVID 19 taskforces, strike team and other engagements**

Members of the OCHLA team are regularly participating in different groups to meet the needs created by the pandemic. Details on the meetings are included with the respective team members’ engagement activity reports. The number of virtual and conference calls has accelerated since last month with our team surpassing over 100 meetings per month. As an example, Director Cavanaugh participated in 44 meetings in April and 63 meetings in May and Community Liaison Lair Marin was present in 35 meetings in April and 55 meetings in May. These numbers do not including the daily press conferences, daily team debriefs and biweekly individual staff planning meetings. The heightened level of activity is required at this time to ensure we stay connected, involved and engaged. One example of such engagement is our participation as members of the Minority Health Strike Team, represented by Director Cavanaugh, where we have been assigned to the Education and Outreach Subcommittee. The Minority Health Strike Team’s report was presented in May with more concrete recommendations to be presented by mid-June. [The Minority Health Strike Team Report can be accessed here.](#)

**ONGOING PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES**

**Mental Health Webinar Series**

We have successfully implemented the collaboration with the National Hispanic & Latino Mental Health Technology Transfer Center Network to host three of the four webinars during April and May. Each session had capacity for 500 participants; yet as shown below, registration in each case exceeded capacity and our expectations, demonstrating the importance of providing this type of relevant and practical training to meet the mental health needs of the community.

### Census 2020

We continue to engage with Latinos through our social media campaign. Ohio's return rate is 65.3% ranking seventh in the nation and a little ahead of the national rate of 60.2%.

### Americorps Vista Program

VISTA recruitment is underway. Candidates have been identified for all open positions and interviews/screening is taking place. We hope to be able to make offers by the middle of June.

### Fiscal Impact of COVID-19

Allotments were completed for FY2021 with a 20% budget forecast decrease for certain specific GRF accounts. This represents a potential shortfall of \$17,842.74. On a separate memo, the board has been asked authorization to consider using funds from the GSF 6010 account to cover this difference. Executive Director Cavanaugh and the Board's Executive Committee continue to monitor and forecast the FY 21 budget needs and will maintain the board informed of the scenarios as they develop.

### Summary of Successes:

#### -Response to COVID 19 Pandemic

Much of our activity has focused on COVID-19 , preparing and attending Virtual Meetings with new COVID-19 Alliances, responding to constituent calls, reaching out to the Ohio Latino Leaders, and compiling COVID-19 resources that have been sent via email to the community organizations and leaders.

-**Bilingual Resources for COVID 19** - Alongside the weekly resources update being emailed, Community Liaison Marin-Marcum has been promoting the newly created OCHLA Bilingual Resources for COVID 19 page.

-**COVID 19 Translations**—Worked as well with translations for several agencies and internally,

-**Connecting with other agencies and partners in response to COVID 19**— Worked on several projects to research and document information on COVID-19 . Joined taskforce committees and groups to share and distribute resources and information. Started as well working closely with ODJFS migrant Ombudsperson on farmworkers project.

-**OCHLA Online Resource Directories:** Finalized the CLOI Directory, the Central Ohio Hispanic Social Services Directory and the Hispanic Faith Directory working with two new interns. Recruited 2 new summer interns.

-**Latino Networking Meetings**—The Akron, Canton and Youngstown Latino Networking meeting were coordinated and successfully held virtually.



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Interns/Volunteers—Continued to onboard two volunteers and debrief one outgoing volunteer. We have at present three volunteers that are assisting the commission virtually with different projects.

The end of May marked the start of the gradual opening of the state and the onset of the Responsible Restart Ohio Plan. We continue to post the press conferences and press releases as they happen. As we shift into a new normal, the press conferences have become less frequent. We also promoted mental health awareness for mental health month and continued to promote the Ohio Latino Mental Health Series. As was predicted at the end of March, the social media numbers are not nearly as high but compared to the numbers of January and most of last year, they are the highest they have ever been on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. The website's statistics are starting to normalize as expected.

**Facebook:**

Facebook gained 32 new page likes and 43 new followers. The Commission was able to reach 25,557 people through Facebook. While that number is lower than when COVID-19 posting first started in March, it is still considerably better than the reach in January and February which was 9,700 and 7,000 respectively. This month there were also fewer posts made, 60 versus 85, which also contributes to the lower metrics. The data is showing that the community relies on the Commission as a source of information and resources and the followers we gained in March have continued to engage with the material we produce.

**Twitter:**

The Commission earned 10 new followers. There were 21.7 K Tweet Impressions this month compared to last month's 28.7K. Like Facebook, there were less tweets this month as activity is gradually normalizing which explains the lower number of impressions.

**Instagram:**

On Instagram we continue to grow steadily. This is the first year of measuring the followers on this platform. We started the year with 475 followers and now have 609. Each month we continue to grow by about 30 followers.

**OCHLA Website:**

This month the website has 12,423 pageviews, 2,403 new users and 337 returning users. The total number of users resembles the numbers from the beginning of this year. I anticipated that as we post fewer new resources and press releases the traffic to the website would decrease. It is encouraging that we gained 2,403 new users visiting the site and are retaining 337. The top pages visited continue to be Coronavirus Resource pages. There was also a significant number of people visiting the job opportunities page. The top pages and their metrics (pageviews) include: Homepage - 1,582; Coronavirus Resource Page- 1,332; Restart Ohio Page- 493; Boletines de Prensa Page- 395; Job Opportunities Page- 362; Agenda Latina 2020 Page- 292; Latino Community Resources Page: 248; Hispanic Serving Organizations Page- 243.

### Summary of Successes:
