Programs and Services

Ombudsman Program - Assistance to clients receiving or needing services for mental health or addiction. Helps clients (or their family members) who are having trouble accessing services, have a complaint with services, or need help coordinating their treatment.

Pro Bono Counseling Program - Links licensed mental health professionals in the community with those who need but cannot afford mental health care.

Perinatal Outreach and Encouragement for Moms (POEM) - Support services for pregnant and parenting women experiencing mental and emotional complications. Services include: support line, mentor program, information and referral and online and in-person support groups.

Get Connected - 6-week class for people with severe mental illness educating them on improving their overall physical health.

Workplace and Community Programs - Conferences and onsite workshops for mental health professionals, community education programs for the general public and workplace programs. Speakers available. Literature on mental health/mental illness subjects.

Support Groups - For friends and family of those with mental illness, depression, bipolar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, pregnancy and postpartum mental illness, schizophrenia/schizoaffective disorder and mindfulness practice.

Online and In-person Mental Health Screenings - The online screening tool currently hosts 9 screens: depression, anxiety, bipolar, PTSD, alcohol and substance use, a youth and parent screen, a work health survey, and a psychosis screen. In-person mental health screenings provided upon request at workplace and community events.
