News Update

The [Protecting Nonprofits from Catastrophic Cash Flow Strain Act](#) has officially become law. This will allow certain governmental entities, federally recognized tribes, and non-profit organizations to make up front payments of 50% of unemployment benefits into the state Unemployment Trust Fund, instead of paying 100% up front and being reimbursed later.
